

Game- Play specific guidelines (Inning 4 / Cohort games)

- No more than 50 people per diamond as outlined by the Provincial Health
 Officer Order regarding gatherings and events, dated July 27th, 2020
 Spectators are allowed, in designated areas (see Diamond Distancing Plan
 attached), as long as they maintain a minimum of two metres distance
 whenever possible.
- Each team (Home and Visitor) is allowed to have a MAXIMUM of 24 players, coaches and spectators.
- The home team is ultimately responsible to ensure full compliance with the LFA Return To Play plan, including the guidelines specified in this document. This includes players, coaches and spectators from both teams.
- All participants (including coaches, players, Role Holders and spectators) will
 maintain a minimum of two metres distance whenever possible and strictly
 adhere to all identified hygiene protocols.
- To ensure physical distancing during arrival and departure from Township of Langley diamonds must be done as per the Ingress & Egress Plan (attached) (https://langleyfastball.ca/wp-content/uploads/sites/2380/2020/08/Noel-Booth-Ingress-Egress-Plan.png)
- Each team is to track their own attendance with their own Attendance Tracker using this <u>mandated Township of Langley COVID Facility Attendee Register</u> at (https://langleyfastball.ca/wp-content/uploads/sites/2380/2020/09/COVID-Facility-User-Attendance-Register-TOL-LFA.pdf)
- The Screener must ask the following four questions to every participant :
 - Are you exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, dry cough, chest or respiratory pain?)
 - Has any member of your household exhibited any symptoms of COVID-19 within the last 14 days?
 - Have you or any other member of your household arrived from outside Canada in the past 14 days?
 - Do you agree to 100% comply with the Host association's specific Return to Play guidelines including but not limited to, spectating (allowed or not allowed), social distancing, and sanitation rules?

- The home team is to take the third base line area. The visiting team to take the first base line area.
- The home team is responsible for sanitization of all high touch surfaces (dugout posts/poles) and shared equipment (such as bases and equipment bin) both before and after the game.
- Bleachers and dug-outs are closed.
- Pick-ups are allowed from your current cohort only. Teams may play with as few as 8 players without being penalized.
- Line up cards must be prepared but will not be physically shared photos may be taken by scorekeepers, etc. and the lineup card must be made available to show the umpire when requested.
- Pre-game meetings will take place at home plate while respecting distancing of at least 2 metres. Only one coach per team and umpire (s) to attend the meeting.
- During the pre-game meeting, the Attendance Trackers from both teams will meet and confirm the total attendees list at the event does not exceed 50 people. If there is in excess of 50 people the Attendance Trackers will alert the coaches and umpires that the game cannot proceed until someone leaves the facility.
- Once the total number of people has been verified the Attendance Tracker from the home team will photograph both attendance tracker forms (Home and Visitor) and e-mail them to covid-attendance@tol.ca with the format of 'Langley Fastball Association – Noel Booth Park - <Diamond> <Date> <Start Time>. For example: "Langley Fastball Association – Noel Booth Park - Southeast Diamond – 2020 Sept 5 – 9:00am"
- All participants are to leave the playing field immediately after the game has ended. No team meetings at the venue post game.
- No team huddles before, during or after the game. Quick chats can be had if 2m distance is maintained.
- No handshake with the opposing team/officials after the game.
- If an injury occurs to a player on that team, either the umpire or coach will call time and only the coach and In Charge person – both wearing protective gloves and face coverings - may go to the injured player, everyone else must maintain physical distancing.
- Face coverings for virus contagion are recommended for all participants; coaches must have face coverings easily accessible to them and must wear them anytime they cannot maintain physical distancing from other participants.
- Face coverings for virus contagion are mandatory for home plate umpires, provided that should an umpire be unable to wear a face covering due to an

- underlying health issue or breathing/overheating concerns, the home plate umpire has the option of calling the game from behind the pitcher's circle as an alternative to wearing a face covering.
- Should a player need to leave the field during play due to breathing concerns associated with wearing a face covering, any player on the bench may replace the removed player and not be counted as a substitution leaving/re-entering the game.
- It is recommended that all participants bring back up face coverings should their original face coverings come off and fall in the dirt when removing their helmet.
- No person should pick-up or handle anyone else's helmet/face covering.
- The umpire is not to handle any equipment other than their own during a game including game balls.
- Defensive team will sanitize the ball for their team during the game. Balls should be routinely rotated and sanitized. The pitcher/catcher will call time and the ball will be given to the Sanitizing Champion to be sanitized, the Sanitizing Champion will throw in a sanitized ball in exchange.
- If a ball goes out of play, a defensive player or coach should retrieve, if possible, then sanitize the ball. If a spectator or offensive team member grabs the ball, they are to sanitize their hands immediately. Then the ball is to be sanitized as well.
- Offensive coaches are to remain a minimum of two metres away from 1st and 3rd base, regardless of where it may locate them on the diamond (as long as it doesn't increase the danger to a coach's personal safety).
- Between pitches, the umpire is to move 2 metres away from the catcher, and the batter is to move 2 metres away from the catcher. Once the play is ready to resume, umpire and batter move back into position, and umpire signals play ball.
- Coach to umpire, player to umpire and umpire to umpire conferences will be done with a two (2) metre distance, unless all participants to the conference are wearing face coverings in which case the conference may be done at normal distance.
- Coach, pitcher and catcher may have a defensive conference at the pitching circle, with a two metre distance being observed by all participants, unless all participants to the conference are wearing face coverings in which case the conference may be done at normal distance.
- Offensive team conference may be held with a two metre distance being observed by all participants, unless all participants to the conference are wearing face coverings in which case the conference may be done at normal distance.

 Teams are to maintain physical distancing while off the field of play, with players in designated spots as appropriate in the ballpark. Spectators will maintain physical distancing, along the sides of the diamond, behind the backstop or in the outfield as appropriate to the layout of the ball park.
