

Sanitizing Champion

A person assigned by a team or group to ensure sanitization of the Facility, shared equipment, and proper participant sanitization during a given softball activity.

They must be available to arrive before the start of the softball activity, stay throughout, and be one of the last to leave the softball activity.

They must be ready to be actively sanitizing throughout the activity.

<u>Before the Activity:</u> Sanitation Champion checks in with Screener and Attendance Tracker. Then heads to equipment bin with Sanitation Bucket to gather rest of disinfecting supplies. i. Disinfect any high-touch surfaces, including posts, bases, equipment bin. ii. Hang hand sanitizer bottle on outside of backstop for spectators. iii. Make sure team hand sanitizer is in a visible spot for easy use.

<u>During the Activity:</u> Sanitation Champion continues to make sure participants are using hand sanitizer on a regular basis. They also make sure shared equipment is sanitized after every drill or during water breaks.

<u>After the Activity:</u> Sanitation Champion uses diamond disinfectant to clean high touch surfaces, including team equipment. Gathers rest of sanitation supplies and places into Sanitation Bucket.

How to Sanitize!

- 1. Use the big sprayer from the green bin to do a quick spray of the bases, and posts around entry to the diamond.
- 2. Use the big sprayer to disinfect the balls periodically throughout the practice. Lay all the balls on the ground and spray, then spin the balls and spray again.
- 3. Use the big sprayer to spray down the nets and tees at the end of practice.
- 4. Use the big sprayer to get a towel damp, use to disinfect bats between players, and game balls.
